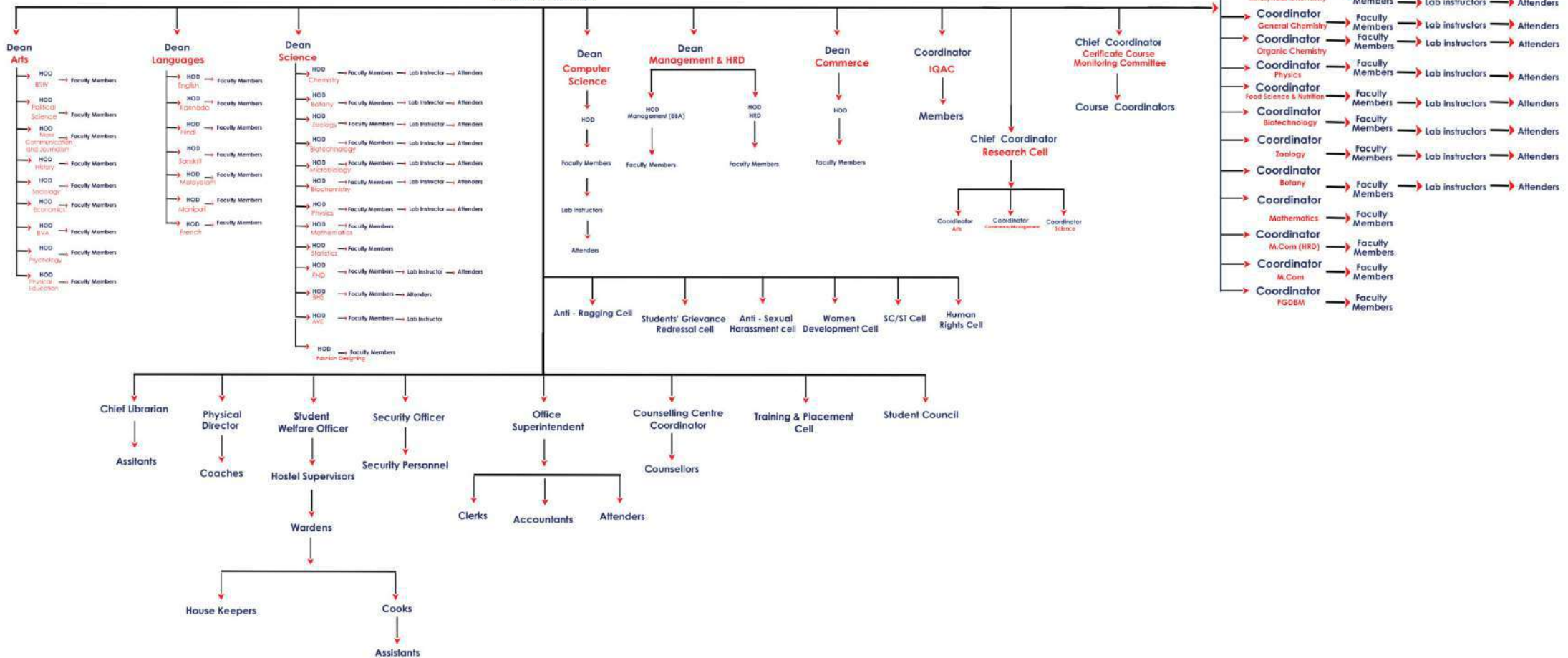

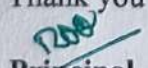

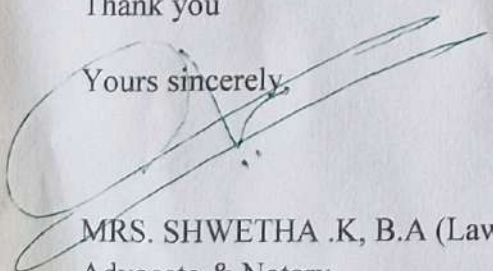

SCOPE

The students to approach the cell for their grievances regarding academic matters, examination matters, financial matters, health services, library and other services.

OBJECTIVE

To provide a mechanism to students of the college to air out their grievances and to provide redressal for the same so that they have smooth tenure at the college from the day of admission to their graduation.

GRIEVANCE REDRESSAL COMMITTEE

As per the AICTE regulations 2019 vide F. No. 1-101/PGRC/AICTE/ Regulation/2019 dated 07.11.2019, Alva's College (Autonomous) has established a structured Online Grievance Redressal Mechanism to ensure a transparent, fair, and accountable academic environment. The college maintains a dedicated Students Grievance Redressal Committee (SGRC), chaired by the Principal and including an Ombudsperson, convener, faculty members, student welfare officer, and a student representative, which is mandated to address concerns from students, faculty, and other stakeholders.

- **Submission & Scope:** Stakeholders can submit grievances online through the official grievance form covering issues such as admission irregularities, fee-related matters, academic evaluation, or harassment.
- **Process & Timeline:** Upon receipt, the committee acknowledges the complaint and schedules a hearing – communicating its decision typically within ten days of the meeting.
- **Resolution & Escalation:** The mechanism is designed for speedy disposal, generally within one month, and provides for further escalation to an Ombudsperson appointed by the University if the aggrieved party is not satisfied with the institutional decision.

This system reflects the institution's commitment to procedural fairness and confidentiality as prescribed in the AICTE Approval Process Handbook.

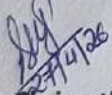

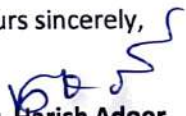

BOARD OF PRACTICAL Training (EASTERN REGION), KOLKATA [BOPT (ER)] under the Department of Higher Education, an autonomous body of Ministry of Education, Government of India and ALVA'S COLLEGE (AUTONOMOUS), MOOBBIDIRE, enter into this understanding that an apprenticeship ('on-the-job' training) component of a minimum of 1 semester and a maximum of 3 semesters for three year undergraduate degree programmes and a minimum of 2 semesters and a maximum of 4 semesters for four year undergraduate degree programmes will be counted as apprenticeships under NATS facilitated by the Board. When these apprenticeships are conducted in the last semester of the course, NATS will provide them with stipendiary support in line with The Apprentices Act, 1961 and Apprenticeship Rules, 1992 and as per the instructions issued by the Ministry of Education, Government of India, from time to time.

1. About BOPT (ER)

- 1.1. Established in 1969, BOARD OF PRACTICAL Training (EASTERN REGION), KOLKATA, is an autonomous organization under the Department of Higher Education, Ministry of Education, Government of India.
- 1.2. The Board is functioning at Block-EA, Sector-I, Salt Lake City, KOLKATA – 700064.
- 1.3. The major function of the Board is to implement and monitor the provisions of The Apprentices Act 1961, as amended in 1973 and 2014, so far as they relate to the training

of Graduates in Technical as well as General streams, in exercise of powers conferred to the Board under Section 23 of the said Act.

2. About the Collaborating ALVAS COLLEGE (AUTONOMOUS)

The college was established in the year 1998 by the visionary Educationalist Dr. M Mohan Alva. The College secured autonomous status in the year 2023-24 & Affiliated to Mangalore University. The traditional courses are redesigned with new combinations to link them closely with employment market – placement training and 100% job or higher education. Provides unique facilities & adoption schemes for outstanding students in academics, sports & games, and also for cultural achievers & physically challenged students as per chairman's desire. The college offers 47 graduate and 15 post graduate courses. The present student strength of the college is 3082. Illustrious achievement in sports, athletics and cultural activities at university, inter-university, national & international levels. Preternatural academic training through forums, clubs, certificate & diploma courses, internship, workshops & seminar life-skill sessions & corporate trainings etc.

3. Definitions

- 3.1. "UGC" will mean the University Grants Commission.
- 3.2. "HEI" will mean (i) Universities included under Section 2(f) of The UGC Act, 1956 (ii) Deemed to be Universities under Section 3 of The UGC Act, 1956 (iii) Institutions funded by Central or State Governments and empowered to award degrees (iv) Affiliated/ Autonomous/ Constituent colleges of the Universities.
- 3.3. "AEDP" will mean **Apprenticeship Embedded Degree Programme**, a programme enabling a student admitted to an undergraduate programme of the Higher Education Institution, recognized as per The UGC Act, 1956, to pursue apprenticeship training as a mandatory integrated component of the Degree programme in compliance with UGC Guidelines for Higher Educational Institutions (HEIs) to offer Apprenticeship Embedded Degree Programme (AEDP). The said AEDP programme will adhere to all the guidelines published by University Grants Commission (UGC) from time to time as applicable to the programme, and as per guidelines issued by Government of India.
- 3.4. "Board" will mean BOARD OF PRACTICAL TRAINING (EASTERN REGION), KOLKATA [BOPT (ER)] which is an autonomous body of Department of Higher Education, Ministry of Education, Government of India.
- 3.5. "ACM" will mean ALVA'S COLLEGE (AUTONOMOUS)

- 3.6. "NATS" will mean National Apprenticeship Training Scheme, the flagship Scheme of Ministry of Education, Government of India for Skilling Indian Youth in various trade disciplines. NATS under the provisions of The Apprentices Act, 1961, and The Apprenticeship Rules, 1992, both as amended from time to time till date, offers Graduates practical, 'hands-on', 'On-the-Job-Training (OJT)' based skilling opportunities for a duration of one year for technical courses, and six months to three years for non-technical courses. However, the stipendiary support by the Government of India will be restricted to the first year only.
- 3.7. "NATS 2.0 Portal" will mean the National portal for NATS having the URL <https://nats.education.gov.in>;

4. Background

- 4.1. National Education Policy, 2020, emphasizes to bridge the Education-Employability gap among students. Apprenticeship is a tried and tested model to improve the employability of students.
- 4.2. In accordance with that, UGC has issued revised Guidelines for Higher Educational Institutions HEIs to offer Apprenticeship Embedded Degree Programme (AEDP) in 2025 under which HEIs are required to offer Apprenticeship Embedded Degree Programme (AEDP) at undergraduate level, with a mechanism of industry-academia linkages and outcome-based learning of students.
- 4.3. The objectives of the AEDP are as follows:
- 4.3.1. To enhance the employability of students pursuing Undergraduate level Degree programmes through a stipendiary apprenticeship.
 - 4.3.2. To focus on outcome-based learning in all Degree programmes to achieve graduate attributes and desired proficiency levels.
 - 4.3.3. To promote active linkage between HEIs and industries/ establishments.
 - 4.3.4. To bridge the skill gap in the industries by effectively implementing AEDP in partnership with HEIs and/or BOARD of Apprenticeship Training (BOATs)/ Board of Practical Training (BOPT).

5. Purpose of the MoU

- 5.1. The specific purpose of this MoU is to establish a relationship and cooperation between the Board and the Collaborating HEIs to ensure that the industrial training component of the Degree programme is covered as apprenticeship under NATS. Furthermore, if the

industrial component is conducted in the last academic cycle or semester of the Degree Programme, it will receive stipendiary support from Government of India under NATS, in line with The Apprentices Act, 1961 and Apprenticeship Rules, 1992 as amended thereafter.

6. Applicability of the MoU

- 6.1. The MoU will be applicable for all AEDP courses recognised as per The UGC Act, 1956, and considered to be compliant by UGC as mentioned in the AEDP Guidelines 2025, to pursue apprenticeship training as an integrated component of the Degree programme in compliance with these guidelines. The said AEDP programme will adhere to all the guidelines published by University Grants Commission (UGC) from time to time as applicable to the programme.
- 6.2. The MoU will be applicable for all AEDP courses falling under the ambit of a statutory or regulatory body/council other than UGC as mentioned in the AEDP guidelines, after taking prior approval of their concerned statutory or regulatory body/council and in compliance with its guidelines.
- 6.3. All the provision(s) of The Apprentices Act, 1961, and The Apprenticeship Rules, 1992, as amended from time to time will supersede all or any clause of this MoU in case it is found conflicting in nature.
- 6.4. This MoU and activities mentioned therein will cover the institutions guided by Alva's College (Autonomous) and students of these institutions. It will be the responsibility of the Heads of institutions to motivate the participation of students in the activities.

7. Period of MoU

- 7.1. This MoU will come into effect from the date of signature by both parties and will be valid for an initial period of four years, however, will be reviewed at every academic year end.
- 7.2. The MoU will be renewed after taking review of the earlier activities as per mutual understanding of both parties, unless terminated or replaced with a new MoU.
- 7.3. The MoU may be modified or terminated by one month written notice to the other party.
- 7.4. The termination of MoU will not affect the commitment and on-going activities which are planned or are being executed at the time of termination.

8. Roles and Responsibilities of the Board

- 8.1. The Board will register and onboard Establishments, students, and HEIs onto the NATS 2.0 portal.
- 8.2. The Board will make the provision for the NATS 2.0 portal to manage the AEDP apprenticeship lifecycle for students enrolled in Apprenticeship Embedded Degree Programmes of eligible HEIs, which offer an apprenticeship component of a minimum of 1 semester and a maximum of 3 semesters, for three year undergraduate degree programmes, and a minimum of 2 semesters and a maximum of 4 semesters, for four year undergraduate degree programmes, as per UGC guidelines, amended from time to time.
- 8.3. The Board will provide stipendiary apprenticeships for AEDP courses under NATS only for apprenticeship spells in the last year of the course.
- 8.4. The Boards will undertake efforts to provide apprenticeship opportunities to all eligible students as per The Apprentices Act, 1961 and facilitate interactions between HEIs and Establishments. The Board will ensure the arrangement of apprenticeship opportunities, subject to requisite support from concerned HEIs, Establishments, and State and District Departments/Authorities.
- 8.5. The Board will support the HEIs and industry partners in their process of devising a framework for the assessments of apprentices, which may be congruent to the overarching guidelines followed by HEIs.
- 8.6. The Board will organize workshops/ seminar/ meetings with establishments/ industries and industry associations with support of HEIs to promote Apprenticeship Training through AEDP under NATS.
- 8.7. The Board will be responsible for issuance of 'Certificate of Proficiency (CoP)' through NATS 2.0 portal subject to the training establishment uploading all requisite information for generation of such Certificates.
- 8.8. The financial support of Government share of stipend to student will be available only while undergoing Apprenticeship Training component in final year of undergraduate level programme.
- 8.9. (i) The Board will aim that the provisions of The Apprenticeship Rules, 1992, are fully implemented by the Establishments. The Board will aim to set-up of Beneficiary Identification Systems which will monitor the payment processes. The Board will also aim to make available Grievance Redressal systems to handle scenarios related to stipend payment grievances. (ii) After ensuring that the establishment has filled the monthly ROP details of the apprentices and paid its share of stipend, the Board would transfer the

- 9.13. The Alva's College (Autonomus) and Board may impart new-age skills under NATS viz. AI, ML, IoT, Blockchain, and more to make the youth aware of and immersed in these skills.
- 9.14. The Alva's College (Autonomus) may establish NATS Facilitation Centers in their campus, which will help in the facilitation of NATS awareness, NATS 2.0 portal registrations, issue resolution, and more so that more aspirants will enroll for AEDP courses.
- 9.15. The Alva's College (Autonomus) may integrate concepts from the industry training in their course curriculum, as relevant and in consultation with the establishments.
- 9.16. The Alva's College (Autonomus) is expected to track the outcomes of the pass-outs from such programmes for a period of at least 1 year, and recommended for up to 5 years, after the completion of the programme to assess the employment and education pathways pursued by such candidates and contribute to the further development of AEDP. These details will be shared with the Board as well.
- 9.17. The Alva's College (Autonomus) may facilitate establishing an Apprenticeship Alumni Connect to further students' interest and awareness of NATS.
- 9.18. The Alva's College (Autonomus) will identify a SPOC (Single Point of Contact) to coordinate and facilitate with the concerned establishments for the smooth and successful completion of the apprenticeship training.
- 9.19. Both the parties to nominate and inform the names of their coordinators for effective communication and ease of performing the activities along with communication details.
- 9.20. The Alva's College (Autonomus) will mandatorily submit a list of all the programmes covered under AEDP in the prescribed format and nomenclature (**Annexure - A**) for onward submission to the NATS 2.0 Portal team so that the courses could be listed on the NATS 2.0 Portal and made available for the students for selection during their enrollment process.

10. Notices

- 10.1. Any notice or other communication under this MoU will be given in writing and delivered by hand, sent by post, facsimiled transmission, or e-mail.

11. Amendment

- 11.1. This MoU may be amended on consent of both the parties to align with the Guidelines published by University Grants Commission (UGC) from time to time as applicable to implementation of AEDP.
- 11.2. This MoU may be amended on consent of both the parties to align with the provision(s) of The Apprentices Act, 1961, and The Apprenticeship Rules, 1992, as amended from time to time.
- 11.3. This MoU may be amended on consent of both the parties to align with the provision(s) and directions of the Ministry of Education, as issued from time to time.

12. Force Majeure

- 12.1. Neither party will be liable to the other for failure or delay in the performance of any of its obligations under this MoU for the time and to the extent such failure or delay is caused due to acts of God, natural disaster, fire, floods, explosions or earthquake, epidemic or quarantine restrictions, serious accidents, war, insurrection or riots, strikes, legal necessity or labor troubles, or any other cause beyond the party's reasonable control, provided that sufficient notice of such occurrence of force majeure is communicated to the other party.

13. Signatures

- 13.1. This MoU constitutes in principle to proceed and work out more detailed modalities to operationalize the same between the parties. No amendments consent or waiver of terms of this MoU will bind either party unless in writing or signed by both parties.
- 13.2. Both the parties agree and assure each other about the secrecy and maintaining the privacy of all sorts of communication and details of students during the period of MoU and thereafter.

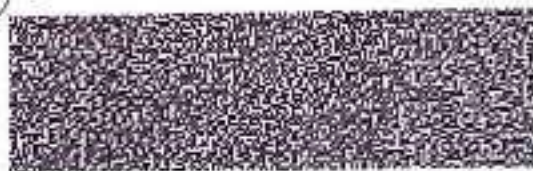
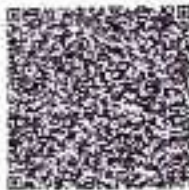

AND WHEREAS, the Parties had earlier executed a Memorandum of Understanding on 31st January 2025, recording their intent to collaborate for the aforesaid purpose;

AND WHEREAS, in pursuance of the said Memorandum, the Lessor has agreed to demise and the Lessee has agreed to accept on rent the premises and facilities described herein, upon the terms and conditions hereinafter appearing;

NOW THIS AGREEMENT WITNESSETH AS FOLLOWS:

1. The Lessor hereby grants to the Lessee, and the Lessee hereby accepts, the right to use and occupy certain portions of the premises situated within Alva's College, Smt. Sundari Ananda Alva Campus, Vidyagiri, Moodbidri – 574227, Dakshina Kannada, Karnataka, more particularly described as follows:
 - a. Classroom: measuring 611 sq. ft., situated on the third floor (Lat: N 13°03'40.9" / Long: E 74°58'31.5").
 - b. Drone Assembly and Maintenance Area: measuring 532 sq. ft., situated on the third floor.
 - c. Sports Ground: measuring 10,140 sq. meters (Lat: N 13°03'46.1" / Long: E 74°58'28.2"), for the purpose of drone flying training.
2. The Lessee shall pay to the Lessor a monthly rent of Rs. 60,000/- (Rupees Sixty Thousand Only). The obligation to pay rent shall commence from the date on which the RPTO receives authorization from the Directorate General of Civil Aviation (DGCA). Rent shall be payable on or before the 5th day of each calendar month.
3. This Agreement shall remain valid for an initial period of two (2) years, commencing from 31 January 2025, unless terminated earlier in accordance with the terms herein. By mutual consent, this Agreement may be extended for successive periods of one (1) year each.
4. The Lessee shall conduct all training activities strictly in accordance with the rules, regulations, and directives issued by the DGCA from time to time. The Lessor agrees to permit the installation of any safety devices or infrastructure required to meet DGCA compliance.
5. The Lessee shall maintain the leased premises, including classrooms, office space, and the sports ground, in good condition, subject to normal wear and tear. The Lessee shall also be responsible for implementing all reasonable safety and fire-prevention measures.

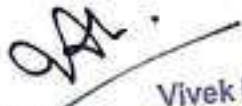

7. Either party may terminate this Agreement by providing a prior written notice of ninety (90) days. However, the Lessor shall be entitled to terminate this Agreement forthwith if the Lessee commits any material breach of the terms herein or engages in any activity contrary to law or in violation of DGCA regulations.
8. MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

THIS Memorandum of Understanding ("MOU") is made on this 10-Dec-2025 ("Effective Date") at Infosys Campus, Mysore.

By and between

Alvas College (Autonomous) – A Unit of Alva's Education a college affiliated to **Mangalore University** having its office at **Moodabidri** represented by its Chairman Dr. M Mohan Alva, (hereinafter referred to as "**College**" which shall mean and include its successors-in-interest, executors, and permitted assigns);

and

Infosys BPM Ltd., having its registered office at Plot Nos. 26/3, 26/4 & 26/6, Electronics City, Hosur Road, Bangalore 560 100 including each of its Affiliates (hereinafter referred to as "**Infosys**" which shall mean and include its successors-in-interest and permitted assigns).

College and Infosys shall herein individually be referred to as the "Party" and collectively as the "Parties".

Whereas,

College enjoys the reputation of being the most preferred institution for higher education in the city. With an academic excellence of over 32 years, College continues to fulfill the holistic educational needs required for the empowerment of students. The College is listed among the Best Colleges at the National Level by various ranking agencies such as The Week, India Today, Times B School, B4Q Management Ltd. etc.

College wishes to introduce an apprenticeship program to train students in Business Process Management ("BPM") sector and seeks to enter a partnership with Infosys to leverage its expertise in this field.

Infosys is a global leader in consulting, technology, and outsourcing solutions and would be willing to consider supporting College in assisting their students in learning about the BPM sector.

NOW THEREFORE, it is mutually understood and declared by and between the Parties as under:

1. Scope of engagement

- a. Infosys may hire graduate or undergraduate students enrolled with the College as apprentices under Apprentice Embedded Degree Program (AEDP). Such hiring will be for a fixed term through a separate hiring agreement

with various terms and conditions such as scope of work, stipend, leaves entitlement, term and termination, etc.

- b. College shall co-operate with Infosys and shall provide with facilities for conducting tests, interviews, training, supervision, and recruitment of students.
- c. College shall be solely responsible for ensuring that all students who are recruited to work with Infosys complete their respective graduate or undergraduate programs and meet all the requirements laid out by the University Grants Commission (UGC) or other relevant authorities.
- d. College shall ensure that any apprentice hired by Infosys would work as an apprentice for at least a period of eighteen (18) months from the date of hiring and shall not leave the apprenticeship program for any non-genuine reasons.

2. Financial Terms

Infosys will not receive any compensation or consideration in return for the support provided under this MoU. Infosys shall not provide College with any scholarship, funds, compensation, or grant, monetary or otherwise, unless separately agreed in writing by the Parties. Infosys may provide stipend to each student recruited as Apprentice. Terms and conditions for such stipend shall be specified in the agreement executed with each student joining as Apprentice.

3. Terms and Termination

It is agreed that the Parties shall jointly explore and work together for a period of 3 years from the Effective Date hereof to give effect to the intent and purpose of this MOU, and which may be extended by such further period as may be mutually agreed upon by the Parties in writing. However, Infosys may terminate this MOU without giving any reason thereof but after giving notice of 90 days to the College.

4. Limitation and Warranties:

- a. College agrees that Infosys shall have no liability whatsoever under this MOU, whether in contracts, torts or otherwise arising out of or in relation to this MOU or the activities specified under this MOU. This document does not create any binding obligations on Infosys and will not be enforceable. Only the future agreements, if any, duly executed by the Parties in writing, will be enforceable.
- b. In addition to the above, in no event shall Infosys be liable for indirect, special, incidental, exemplary, punitive or consequential damages of any kind, including but not limited to loss of profits, loss of use, loss of revenue, loss of goodwill, interruption of business, arising out of or in connection with this MOU, whether in contract, tort, strict liability or otherwise, even if the other party has been advised as such or are otherwise aware of the

possibility of such damages.

5. Exclusivity

Both Parties hereby agree that this MOU is entered on non-exclusive basis and that both Parties shall have the right and the discretion to enter into similar agreements and arrangements with other parties.

6. Force Majeure

Infosys's obligations under this MOU shall be suspended upon the occurrence of force majeure event such as Act of God, flood, earthquake, fire, explosion, act of government, war, civil commotion, insurrection, embargo, riots, lockouts, pandemic, labour disputes affecting such party, for such period as such force majeure event may subsist.

7. Entire agreement

This MOU constitutes the entire understanding between the Parties and may not be modified or amended, except as mutually agreed in writing and signed by both the Parties. This MOU supersedes any other prior arrangement or agreement made by the Parties with respect to the subject matter hereof.

8. Legal status of the parties

This MOU shall not be construed as any agency, company, joint venture, partnership or any other business relationship between the Parties and neither party shall have any authority or power to bind the other or to contract in the name of nor create any liability against the other in any way for any purpose. College is not authorized to enter into contracts or agreements, or make promises, on behalf of Infosys or customers of Infosys or to otherwise create obligations of Infosys or its customers to any College student or to any third parties.

College shall indemnify, and hold harmless Infosys, its affiliates, and all its officers from and against any and all claims, actions, legal proceedings, liabilities, or damages, arising out of or in connection with any claims made under this MOU.

9. Confidentiality

- a. Both Parties shall not disclose any information or material nor make public any literature including instruction material, books, videos, audios, presentations and/or any other material documents that have been provided by either Party for the purpose of the course. The confidentiality obligations shall survive termination of this

MOU and shall continue for additional period of (3) three years after expiry/termination of this MOU. College shall notify Infosys, within 24 hours of becoming aware, about any security breach with respect to Infosys data.

- b. College shall be held liable in case of an information security breach/incident specific to Infosys, which is attributable to any act/omission vulnerability/ on its part, or on part of its employees or its subcontractors/partners.
- c. Infosys, or Infosys appointed third party agency shall have the right to conduct an analysis, forensic or otherwise, in case there are any incidents specific to Infosys. Logs and incident reports specific to the incident shall be shared with Infosys within a reasonable timeframe.

10. Intellectual Property Rights, Trademarks/ Trade Names, Copy Rights etc.

Any content, curriculum, training manual, instruction material (physical or digital) or other relevant material that is created and integrated into the curriculum in pursuance of this MOU shall be owned exclusively by Infosys. Any material existed prior to Effective Date of this MOU or created independent of this MOU by Infosys ("Infosys Material") shall be owned exclusively by Infosys.

For all other purposes, it is clearly understood by & between parties herein that, all intellectual property rights, trademarks/trade names, copy rights, service marks, patents, logos, letter heads, other published material, stationary etc. in respect of Infosys's name / brand name, shall solely and absolutely vest in Infosys and College shall have no rights, claim, lien or encumbrance thereof directly or indirectly except the usage of trade mark/trade name on brochures, published material etc. for the purpose of education/ training/noncommercial promotional activities. However, for any other usage, permission in writing is required from Infosys and subject to conditions, restrictions & for the period as may be prescribed by Infosys.

Infosys hereby agrees to allow College to refer to it as an 'Industry Partner with Infosys' and make use of its name and logo for publishing on College's website and related material for publicity as per the trademark and logo usage guidelines, mentioned in **Annexure – I**. College shall ensure that all usage of Infosys name and logo is always compliant with Annexure – I.

Infosys hereby agrees that the consent of no other person or entity is required to enable College to use its "INFOSYS" logos and that such use in accordance with the terms of this MoU will not violate or infringe upon the trademarks, trade names, copyright, artistic of Infosys, and/or other rights of any third parties.

11. Privacy & Data Protection

In relation to the performance of this MOU, the privacy and data protection obligations on the Parties are as set forth in **Annexure II** and the Parties agree to comply with the same. College shall ensure that all students of the College that engage with Infosys are fully aware of, and compliant with, Annexure II at all times.

12. Compliance with Laws

College acknowledges that it is of utmost importance to Infosys that any entity that engages with Infosys complies with all the relevant applicable laws. College agrees to comply with all relevant laws mentioned in **Annexure III** and shall ensure that all students of the College that engage with Infosys are fully aware and compliant with Annexure III at all times. Notwithstanding anything contained elsewhere, upon breach of any laws mentioned in Annexure III, Infosys shall have a right to terminate this MOU immediately.

13. Jurisdiction and Dispute Resolution

In the event of any dispute arising out of or in connection with this MOU, the Parties will attempt in good faith to resolve such dispute through negotiations between them. Post negotiations, all or any of the disputes shall be resolved through arbitration, as per the procedure mentioned in the Arbitration and Conciliation Act, 1996 and the seat and venue of arbitration shall be Bangalore, India. This MOU, and any dispute arising from the relationship between the parties to this MOU whether contractual or non-contractual, shall be governed by the laws of India, excluding its conflict of laws principles.

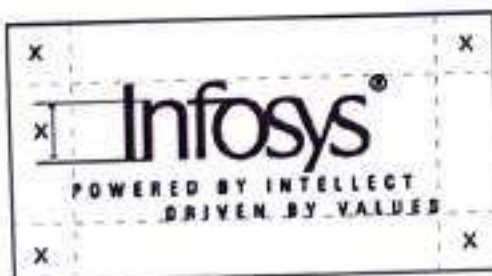

1. Definitions:

- v. **'Personal Data' Breach** means a breach of security leading to the accidental or unlawful destruction, loss, alteration, unauthorized disclosure of, or access to, personal data transmitted, stored or otherwise processed.
- vi. **'Processing'** or any other derivative thereof, means any operation or set of operations performed upon PI, whether or not by automatic means, such as collection, recording, organization, structuring, storage, adaptation or alteration, consultation, use, disclosure by transmission, dissemination or otherwise making available, alignment or combination, restriction, blocking, erasure or destruction.

2. Processing of Personal Data

- i. The parties agree that in connection with the main agreement (hereinafter "Agreement"), the parties may share Personal Information regarding their respective employees, partners, customers, prospects and other data subjects (hereafter "Data subjects"), and that such information may constitute PI under Applicable Privacy Laws.
- ii. Partner and Infosys shall each act as a data controller with regard to use and processing of personal information for the purposes contemplated by the Agreement. The Parties shall each comply with Applicable Privacy Laws directly applicable to their respective use of each other's Personal Information, relating to the collection, use, processing, protection or disclosure of Personal Information, in the course of carrying out their respective obligations under this Agreement. Both Parties agree to negotiate in good faith to amend the DPA and the Agreement as necessary to address changes to Applicable Privacy Laws.
- iii. If Partner provides Infosys with Personal Information under this Agreement, Partner agrees to provide all relevant notices and obtain any consents required to share the information with Infosys and such notices and consents must sufficiently inform data subjects of the purposes for which personal information is collected.
- iv. The Partner agrees in respect of any such PI supplied to it by Infosys that it shall: (a) only act as necessary for the purpose of rendering services warranted by Infosys; (b) regarding the processing of such PI under this

Agreement it shall ensure that appropriate technical and organizational measures shall be taken against unauthorized or unlawful processing of PI and against accidental loss or destruction of, or damage to, the personal data; and (c) comply with any reasonable request made by Infosys to ensure compliance with the measures contained in this Section. The Partner will not process, or refrain from processing, any act that puts Infosys in breach under the Applicable Privacy Laws and shall indemnify Infosys and its officers, directors and employees for any breach of any Applicable Privacy Laws, which renders Infosys liable for any costs, claims or expenses.

- v. Nothing in this Agreement shall be deemed to prevent the Parties from taking steps it reasonably deems necessary to comply with the Applicable Privacy Laws.
- vi. For the purposes of this DPA, "Applicable Privacy Laws" means all laws, codes, statutes, rules and regulations with which each Party is legally obliged to comply during the term of this Agreement.

Annexure III

1. ANTI-SEXUAL HARASSMENT

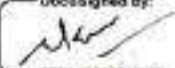

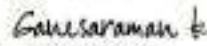
1. Introduction

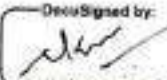
2. **24/7 CHARITABLE TRUST Responsibilities:**

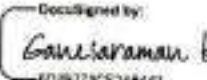
- 2.1. Will provide necessary training as per Training Program requirements and curriculum for delivery as decided between the parties.

3. **Other Terms & Conditions:**

The following are other terms and conditions of engagement:

- 3.1. **Batch Size:** The total number of students to be engaged per batch would be 30

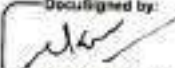
5. Indemnification

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7. Notices:

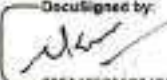

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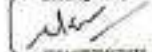

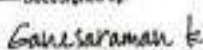
